

Street entrance to hospital changing Other improvements continue

Patients and visitors driving onto the campus at Monadnock Community Hospital will notice several changes to the campus entrance and parking lots for the next four to eight weeks.

Entrance from Old Street Road

Construction recently began on a roundabout (see #1 on the map), which will be located on the MCH campus at the current entrance. Traffic entering and exiting the grounds will be re-routed to the left of the current entrance. The hospital sign will be moved to a new spot near the road and memorial plaques safely stored.

We expect the roundabout to be completed in the next ten weeks.

In addition, trees have been removed on the south side of the entrance to accommodate a new parking area.

Directional Signs and Flagmen

Additional directional signs have been added to help patients and visitors find their way. Flagmen are also directing traffic, especially in areas where construction vehicles are crossing hospital roads.

With the exception of the campus entrance and roundabout construction, all hospital roads and access to the



Emergency Department, Physician offices, Hospital and Bond Wellness Center are currently the same.

Additional Campus Improvements

In addition to the items mentioned above, you can expect to see the following improvements in the next four weeks:

- Completion of the detention pond (see #2 on map)
- Completion and opening of the New Upper Parking Lot (see #3)
- First phases of construction for the perimeter road (see #4)
- Closing of half of the Middle Parking Lot (see #5)
- Temporary nursery at the former MFS Adult Day Center

Connector Road from Route 202

The Town of Peterborough and MCH are currently in the bidding process with construction vendors for the Connector Road (see #7). We will keep you posted as this progresses.
