

Site Work Starts on Generator Building

Improvements on the hospital campus have been steady and will continue throughout the fall and winter. The next few weeks will bring improvements in these areas:

- Connecting to the town's water main at Old Street Road
- Preparing the new upper parking lot to the right of the street entrance
- Constructing a roundabout at the current street entrance

Parking

Parking spaces nearest to the buildings have been more difficult to find in the past few weeks and we apologize for this inconvenience. If you have limited mobility and cannot find a close parking spot, please try the following:

- Drop-off areas near the hospital, Bond Wellness Center and Medical Arts Buildings
- Handicapped spots for those with a registered card

We are asking hospital employees to use the furthest parking lots to allow patients easier access to our buildings.



Rocks and small boulders that have been dug up during parking lot construction are being stockpiled. They will be used to create natural retaining walls in place of concrete.

Generator Building

Site work has begun behind the hospital, near the cafeteria, for a new building to house emergency power generators. The new generators will replace the existing ones and will provide power for an extended period of time during outages.

Rock Recycling

If you've been on the MCH campus recently, you may have noticed what we are affectionately calling the "rock nursery" – a holding area that is full of small boulders.

We are re-using all rocks found during construction in other areas of the campus. For example, boulders are currently being used on the slope near the generator building. Instead of creating a concrete retaining wall, the

boulders will naturally protect the slopes from erosion.
