

Roundabout Construction At Hospital Entrance

Visitors and patients should be alert when driving onto the campus

In the past month, there have been many noticeable changes to the MCH campus that we'd like to share with you.

Roundabout Construction to Begin at Current Street Entrance

In early April, crews will start work on the roundabout at MCH's current street entrance (see #1 on map). We expect construction to continue for six to eight weeks.

We will minimize the amount of changes to the driving pattern as cars enter and exit the campus. When a change is necessary, flagmen will be present to help safely direct traffic.

Construction has also increased on the hospital's perimeter road (see #2 & #3) and will continue throughout the spring. *Please remain alert and drive slowly and carefully on the hospital grounds.*



Town Connector Road

Earlier this month, the Town of Peterborough began site work for its connector road (See #4). The roadway has been cleared and construction crews will continue preparing the ground for the road.

When complete, this road will improve access to the hospital for patients and emergency medical vehicles. At the same time, it will reduce traffic on town roads and intersections that have historically been congested and, at times, dangerous, including Old Street Road, Sand Hill Road and the intersection of Route 202, 136 and Old Street Road.

Both the Town's connector road

and MCH's perimeter road are currently scheduled to be complete this fall. At that time, the hospital's street entrance will be moved from the present entrance on Old Street Road to the roundabout at the end of the connector road (see #5).

Other Updates

- The outside shell of the generator building (see #6) is complete.
- The Helipad has been reopened
